This image from Paul's 2nd letter to the Corinthians echoes the imagery in Jeremiah of God as the Potter, moulding and shaping pots of clay. 


On Palm Sunday we also held our Messy Church event for local families "Messy Easter" when through a range of crafts and other fun activities we looked at the whole of the Easter Story.







Gardening



"I wandered lonely as a cloud that floats on high o'er vales and hills, when all at once I saw a crowd, a host, of golden daffodils....." (William Wordsworth 1770-1850)

William wrote this poem in April 1804 inspired by a walk with Dorothy, some 222 years ago, on the shores of Ullswater at Glencoyne Bay.

As I write this, in early March, the Narcissus Pseudonarcissus is in full bloom. February 2024 recorded the highest rainfall & temperature in parts of England, since records began in 1836.....when William, Mary & Dorothy were walking yonder hills. Is this yet another sign of global warming?

Finally British Summer Time has arrived, with lighter nights and the garden really coming to life. Seed packets whisper "sow, sow, sow". Here are some ideas for flowers and vegetables you might like to try sowing this month. Now is a good time to start thinking about wildflower mixes, adding in those saved seeds from last Autumn such as Ammi, Daucus, Nigella and Californian poppies. Mix seed with silver sand to give a better broadcast. Poor soil and full sun will work best for wild flowers but do remember to water. Cosmos Purity and Dazzler, Zinnias, Sunflowers, Nicotiana, Tithonia (Mexican Sunflower with fluorescent orange flowers) all have a special place in the garden. Start these under glass for the promise of a glorious display from July onwards, with plenty to gather as a sensational bouquet for a friend. Dried flowers have seen a revival, some of our suggestions to try, from seed, being Helichrysums, Callistephus, Scabious Sternkugel & Honesty, all great for pollinators and the Planet. Take time to plan and think about plant combinations & colour themes, to turn a "nice garden" into a "work of art".

Top of the vegetable list comes Sweetcorn (Lark & Swift always perform well). Start them off inside or under glass, being careful to spot any mice who may be pilfering the seed! You will be eating your first delicious cobs by the end of August. French Beans and Courgettes are firm favourites; why not try Cosse Violette Climbing French Bean growing up Hazel supports or a yellow Courgette, Shooting Star. These are guaranteed to add flavour and colour to your plate. The Brassica family can be sown now; Calabrese Green Magic performs well, providing repeat florets for many weeks. Sow salad crops including rocket and micro greens along with fresh herbs (with a little helping hand from heat) to enjoy tasty fresh salads as a welcome accompaniment to "al fresco" dining.

Remove spreading "thugs" such as Lysimachia; there is always an excuse to find space for new perennials, bought locally and grown by a specialist nursery. If your Dahlias have started to sprout, they can now be potted up or planted out, towards early May, being sure to give some protection from frost.

Finally, why not become a Community Scientist by joining a bumblebee survey. Such are the challenges facing our bumblebee population; habitat loss, pesticides and climate change, that The Bumblebee Conservation Trust and RHS have teamed up to conduct surveys until 31 May www.rhs.org.uk/science/help-our-research/bumbles-on-blooms. There has been lots going on in school this last half-term: \(\text{L} \) lots of exciting trips, sporting activities and Science!

Science week was a great success last year and this year was even better. Class 1 kicked off their Science theme by planting beans and painting daffodils. They also explored sound waves and rhythm. Mrs Barclay brought her electric drums to school and Class 1 played them and Mrs Barclay led a drumming and rhythm session.

As part of their work on the book The Owl who was afraid of the dark, Class 2 have been painting with light. Working against a black backdrop, they made pictures by moving their lights around. They have also had fun racing cars they made in DT. Working in pairs they learnt about how wheels and axels work. They also learnt about how a car needs thrust to move. The children made decisions thinking about the materials used to make the cars. After their super car races, Class 2 continued their DT work, looking at Axels and Wheels. Working in groups, with lots of help from parents, they created some superb Ferris Wheels.

This year, Class 1 and 2 have been thinking about different types of flight. Class 1 have learnt about the Apollo astronauts travelling to the moon and Class 2 have learnt all about the Wright Brothers and their experiments with flight. They had a fabulous day out at the Air Museum in Carlisle to see some real aeroplanes close up.

Class 3 have been studying Owls and other birds. They have learnt what they have in common but also what makes them different to each other. They have used their knowledge to design birds of their own and had a day at Leighton Moss to finish off their topic.

Class 4 have been looking at the human life cycle in some of their Science Week sessions. They made Teabag Babies - cardboard babies with a tea bag attached to the back of the head and the chest. They had to keep the baby safe and dry all week. They even had to bring the babies in to the Class 4 Baby Club every day!

Some older children took part in the final of the Lancashire School's Indoor Athletics this half term. They travelled by coach to Blackpool and competed with 12 other schools. They were a great team and represented us brilliantly.

We had a fun day on Red Nose Day as usual – Wild hair, clothes back to front, underpants on heads, etc and over £100 raised for Comic Relief.



May you be held by the God of compassion as you remember your loved ones today.


